In West and Central Africa, UNWOMEN has made significant progress on normative framework both at regional and country levels. At regional level, partnership with ECCAS resulted to the drafting of the first binding regional EAW Convention if adopted in 2024 it will have a real impact on the lives and rights of estimated hundred million women and girls in the region of Central Africa that are currently subject to SGBV. At country level CAR developp the law on sexual harassment in school to protect girls rights and access to education on post-conflict environment.
