STRATEGIC NOTE OUTCOME PROGRESS NOTE SHOWING DATA OF : **2022**

By 2026, all people in Zimbabwe, especially women and girls and those in the most vulnerable and marginalised communities, benefit from equitable and quality social services and protection. (UNSCDF Outcome 1)

To ensure that women and girls survivors of Gender Based Violence have access to quality essential services, the CO popularised the referral pathways in communities through its consortiums working in 5 Spotlight Initiative provinces. The consortiums are using the social accountability mechanisms such as the Scorecard and they are demanding quality services from service providers operating in their provinces. To date, Implementing partners including Community Based organisations trained on Social Accountability met with the duty bearers and service providers within their areas and demanded change of attitude by service providers to clients especially by health personel. Some participated in local districts budgeting processes.
