There is a Male involvement strategy for the prevention of sexual gender base violence in sierra leone which is currently being used by development partner to support norms change in communities. However, because the strategy doesnot have an evidence based behavioral change model, this makes it more challenging to measure change. Plans are underway for a revision of the strategy to incorporate an evidence-based behavioral model.
