Iraqi Government and key stakeholders (including non-ministerial entities) developed and are now able to use 8 sectoral plans at federal level and 1 plan at regional level in Kurdistan to strengthen the implementation of the UNSCR1325 NAP II at the national and local (governorate) level. The plans – which include clear outcomes, activities, baselines, indicators and targets – ensure the clear definition of roles and responsibilities of line ministries and non-ministerial entities with regards to NAP II pillars and expected results. As such, the plans strongly contribute to enhance coordination, transparency and accountability of all stakeholders for the implementation and monitoring of the Plan and specifically with regards to the protection and promotion of women and girls' rights and their effective participation in peacebuilding and security sectors with a view of enhancing protection, social protection, social cohesion and peaceful societies. UN Women provided technical and coordination support during the planning process.
