UN Women's Programme on Women, Peace and Security (WPS) directly contributes to SDG (16) : Promote peaceful and inclusive societies for sustainable development, provide access to justice for all and build effective, accountable and inclusive institutions at all levels In 2022, the programme has mainly contributed to the outcome of promoting the empowerment of women through interventions that support the peace, security and resilience in the communities as well as the meaningful participation of women in peacebuilding. UN Women raised the WPS Agenda in BARMM by ensuring that needs of women and girls in conflict-impacted areas area reflected in local Gender and Development plans in over 17 local government units, ensuring that programs and services reach the most vulnerable women and girls in the Bangsamoro region.
