More men and boys and women and girls adopt attitudes, norms and practices that advance gender equality and women's empowerment, including those that promote positive social norms

A change in attitude and behavior has been noted in favor of the protection of women and girls in Senegal. Training sessions for service providers and activists have contributed to changing practices and improving the prevention of violence. Community involvement and the participation of men and boys have strengthened the community movement against violence, and harmful practices. The religious, customary and traditional leaders have amplified their voice against the violence, which has greatly reduced the violence in the areas with high prevalence, in other words, Ziguichor, Ké dougou, Kolda, Tamba. UN Women in its support program for civil society organizations has revitalized the movement of leaders and activists who campaign for the respect of the rights of women and young girls. The implementation of positive masculinity through the regional summit on positive masculinity has contributed to the strengthening of men's commitment but also to the reduction of gender stereotypes.
